Sr. No.	Area	Details	
1	Description	Location Manager in the Media & Entertainment Industry is the person responsible identifying a suitable location for filming and managing any production requirements at the location. The job holder are responsible for filming/ production taking place on location. Their main tasks include evaluating various locations and identifying those that are most suited for filming. The location manager is in charge of set-up, logistics and coordination at the filming location.	
2	Personal Attributes	This job requires the individual to understand production techniques and the implications of various tasks on time, resources and budget. The individual must have a background in film making or content production. The individual must understand the logistics and facilities required during filming and be able to assess a range of locations for their suitability. The individual should have a keen sense of visual imagery and photography, and apply this to location selection. The individual must be an effective communicator and be able to support the production unit in making relevant decisions about the location.	
3	Minimum Educational Qualifications	Preferable Class Graduate,	
4a	Domain Certification	Certified for Job Role: "Location Manager" mapped to QP: "MES/Q2804, v1.0". Minimum accepted score is 70%	
4b	Platform Certification	Recommended that the Trainer is certified for the Job Role: "Trainer", mapped to the Qualification Pack: "MES/Q 2804". Minimum accepted % as per respective SSC guidelines is 60%.
