



Subhash Ghai The Pioneer & The Showman

A doyen of the Hindi film industry, Subhash Ghai has and always will be a film-maker who has left no stone unturned in giving us movies that are larger than life, mounted on a huge canvas and replete with high drama while being truly Indian at their emotional core. For Subhash Ghai merely dreaming was never enough—it was more important to turn his dreams into reality. It would be fair to say that he lives and breathes films. He has worked successfully with the biggest stars like Shah Rukh Khan, Salman Khan, Rishi Kapoor, Shatrughan Sinha, Dilip Kumar, Raaj Kumar and leading ladies like Aishwarya Rai Bachchan, Kareena Kapoor Khan and Katrina Kaif all adding up to a formidable repertoire of commercially hit films that goes to make Subhash Ghai an institution by himself.



His passion for all aspects of film-making, and his relentless pursuit of learning has undoubtably been responsible for Subhash Ghai's meteoric rise. When it comes to his films, he strives for perfection, keeping a vigilant eye on every creative and business detail. It is this very quality, an astute understanding of the craft and the business together with a determination to learn, that has earned him the epithet of 'The Showman'.

Like several young men, Subhash Ghai had his heart set on becoming an actor and it was with this intention in mind that he enrolled at the renowned Film and Television Institute of India (FTII) in Pune where he learnt not just about acting, but also film writing and direction. It is no wonder that Subhash Ghai is among the rare film-makers of his time to have delivered the highest number of grand hits like Kalicharan, Karz, Karma, Hero, Khalnayak, Pardes, Taal to name just a few. A storyteller par excellence, his movie-making process combines hi-quality drama with astute observation of trends and audience taste, always hitting the sweet spot between creativity and commerce. Constantly in sync with the changing times, it is no surprise that his films with their sound emotional core continue to find resonance even with the younger generation.



Life, he often says, has been his greatest teacher and he in turn has groomed and mentored some of the greatest talents in Hindi cinema. Relaunching Madhuri Dixit's career (who till then had only acted in inconspicuous films) and turning her into a star is one of the legendary feats that made him famous as the man with the Midas touch. In fact, such was Subhash Ghai's unerring instinct in spotting talent that he transformed a bevy of youngsters with no formal training in acting into matinee idols--Anil Kapoor, Manisha Koirala, Jackie Shroff and Meenakshi Seshadri to name just a few of them.

Subhash Ghai on his part has always championed the cause of training and education as being the best way for getting a head start in any field. "It is always important that one is aware of the basics in any field. When I joined

FTII, I got to learn the nitty-gritty and the minute details of the film-making process. Hearnt how to shift from the space of

an actor to a writer and then to a director. It never caused a major issue here in the Mumbai film industry because my basic training at FTII came into good use," says Subhash Ghai who has perfected the knack of moving adeptly from one field of work to another.

Walking the talk, he has given India, Whistling Woods International, an institute with world-class state-of-the-art facilities that has since its inception contributed to the Indian entertainment sector with skilled and well-trained professionals.

storyteller.



Bollywood's Dream Merchant

The Untold Story



Subhash Ghai was born in a family of Punjabi descent that lived in Nagpur, which was at that time in the Central Provinces and Berar, in British India. His father K.D. Ghai, was a dentist by profession, and his mother Subhadra Ghai was a home-maker.

The seeds of this creative streak were perhaps sown in the early days when his mother made him read and summarise the Ramayana and Mahabharat. As a child, he equally enjoyed watching the theatrics of Ramlila performed every year during Dussehra. Quite like in the epics he enjoyed watching and narrating, challenges in his own life began to crop up at a young age.


When he was in school, his parents separated as a result of which a good part of his childhood was spent in a boarding school. On occasions when he had to stay at the hostel during vacations, away from his family, he invented ingenious ways of entertaining himself. He channelled his youthful exuberance into extra-curricular activities like theatre, elocution and debates to first overcome disappointments and later, to fulfil his creative dreams.

Subhash Ghai, since his early teens, broke away from norms and resisted following a conventional path. His father, a dentist, suggested a career of a chartered accountant for

his son, but the young Subhash was more attracted to dance, drama and music. His college days in Rohtak saw him dabble in theatre as a playwright, director and actor and even as a singer. So popular was he that he won himself the title of 'Hero of Punjab University', a first of many such sobriquets that were to follow later.

His goal of working in cinema was not as easy as it seems today. Though everyone recognised Subhash Ghai's talent, his father ignored it, but fortune, as they say, favours the brave. As it turned out, his college principal put in a good word about the young pupil's talent and stellar work in theatre. Subhash Ghai's perseverance and persistence became key to opening the gates of FTII for him and thereby fulfilling his destiny. Imagine his astonishment when his father surprised the young Subhash by presenting him with the admission form of the Film & Television Institute of India, Pune. It was indeed a memorable day in the life of a young and raring to go Subhash. In hindsight, the young man's capacity to turn adversities into opportunities for learning new and varied skills, his ability to think out of the box, suggested that he was a talent to watch out for. In the years to come, he would go on to prove his mettle in the world of films and be counted among the legends of Indian cinema.









My visit here today was such a thrill, such a surprise, I was almost baffled by the amount of infrastructure that exists in this space. The kind of technical education that the students are getting here is invaluable. What Whistling Woods is doing is invaluable and so inspiring that I would want to be a part of something like this. It is such an amazing service and such an amazing way to give back. I will never forget my interaction with students. There should be a Halo around Whistling Woods and the sanctity of this place should never be contaminated. It should exist in its purity and create a generation that will come out from here inspired and that will go on a long way in shaping the world of tomorrow. That is the natural progression in all ways, in a creative way and I am leaving this place proud today.

Learning Skills For Life


With hopes held high and an ardent desire to fulfil his destiny, Subhash Ghai threw himself into learning every little thing he could at the Film & Television Institute of India, Pune. An avid student and an achiever he was always a favourite with the teachers at FTII. It was here that he came in contact with the renowned film-maker Ritwik Ghatak who made quite an impression and opened up his mind to the world of movies. The institute broadened his horizons like no other. Learning about the intricacies of film-making young Subhash's excitement knew no bounds and very quickly he found himself engrossed in learning about direction, editing, and even sound design!

While career goals were fast taking shape during Subhash Ghai's stint in FTII, an unexpected event occurred - he lost his heart to Rehana, a young girl who lived in the guiet Pune neighbourhood where the institute was situated. His relationship was not without hurdles, but his faith to humanity regardless of religion helped him tide over the difficulties and tie the knot with his lady love. While most youngsters take family togetherness as granted, Subhash Ghai, having experienced and navigated himself through a turbulent childhood due to his family travails, understood the importance of striking a work-life balance. Even at that young age he was keen to safeguard and carefully nurture his personal life while embarking on a mission to launch his career in the movies. With hopes held high and an ardent desire to fulfil his destiny, he graduated from the FTII in the vear 1963.

Armed with an FTII degree, and all fired up by his passion to work in Indian cinema, he landed in Mumbai, the city of dreams. The road to success, however, was not strewn with roses. Just getting a foot into the industry was a struggle. An outsider to the film industry, he was not allowed into the studios because he did not have any contacts or a godfather.

Never one to give up easily, Subhash Ghai found a way out. If he didn't have friends and family at the workplace, he realised that he quickly needed to create a few. The answers once again came to him unexpectedly through illuminating books like Dale Carnegie's How to Make Friends and Influence People! He judiciously used the techniques suggested in the book to make his way into a close-knit film industry and managed to connect with producers like B.R.







Chopra and S. Mukherjee who encouraged him to stay put and keep looking for work in Mumbai. His ability to never say never and find solutions to problems was evident since the early days. These traits that helped him even as a student once again came to his rescue not only getting him a footing in the film industry, but also in establishing a lasting network of creative and business associates.

There were other young people like Shatrughan Sinha, Asrani and Javed Akhtar who were struggling too at that time and they would all often meet outside the famed Gaylord restaurant in Mumbai and share their experiences. The friendships that he made in those days would later go on to becoming key to his career. For example, Subhash Ghai went on to direct Shatrughan Sinha in Kalicharan, his very first film as a director.

In 1965, an opportunity knocked at Subhash Ghai's door in the form of United Producers Filmfare Talent Contest. Amongst the eight chosen ones shortlisted from more than 10,000 star aspirants was Subhash Ghai who walked into Indian film history to create a niche for himself. The others amongst these eight were Rajesh Khanna, Dheeraj Kumar and Farida Jalal. While Rajesh Khanna grabbed a role soon after, Subhash Ghai received his opportunity in the Hindi film industry a year later

Dealing with life's adversities, the young man from Nagpur who had dreamt of becoming an actor was now ready to play a role far bigger than what he had set out for. His life was about to change.







From Actor To Writer-Director-The Creative Evolution



Subhash Ghai began his illustrious career in Hindi films as an actor in the movie Taqdeer (1967), a remake of the Konkani film, Nirmonn. It was a film with a stellar support cast of actors like Bharat Bhushan, Farida Jalal and Johnny Walker. From there Subhash Ghai went on to further showcase his acting talents in another film Aradhana (1970) with Sharmila Tagore and Rajesh Khanna. He was also the male lead in the 1970's film Umang with co-stars Rehman, Nadira and Paintal; which he followed up with Sherni, Bharat Ke Shaheed starring Tabassum, Ramesh Deo, Bhushan Tiwari, Hush Bano and Gumraah (1973) with Reena Roy and Danny Denzongpa.

Although Subhash Ghai's innings as an actor was short-lived, he gave it his best shot. A famous anecdote showcases the joie de vivre with which he approached work. The story goes that he once got a role that required him to drive a car in a scene.

When the director asked the young Subhash Ghai, if he knew how to drive, he promptly said 'yes'. The trouble was that he actually did not know how to drive, but so keen was his desire to be an actor that he was willing to put his own self at risk to realise his dream.

But as an actor, he was not happy with the mediocre roles coming his way, and yet he did not lose heart, believing strongly in his own creativity. A person of myriad interests, he began to write scripts that would suit him. In fact director Prakash Mehra wanted to buy one of his scripts, but the young actor refused to budge from his condition that he would get to play the hero in the film. That script did not get made into a film, but it marked a new phase in Subhash Ghai's career - that of a writer-director. His initial attempts at pitching his scripts faced rejection. After his failure as an actor, anyone else would have been dejected, but not Subhash Ghai. He persisted and one day, he met



N.N. Sippy, a stalwart of the film industry, who asked him if he had any script ready. Though Subhash Ghai initially said no, he later admitted that he did have a script which had been rejected six times already.

The stalwart was immediately curious. He agreed to sitting through a story narration by the young Subhash Ghai. After hearing the narration, N.N. Sippy exuberantly exclaimed, "How did this script get rejected? This is an excellent story!"

Subhash Ghai was elated. He had put his heart and soul into the script that incorporated the varied creative lessons he had learned through the different phases of life. The script, was for a film called Kalicharan.

Subhash Ghai's hard work and perseverance was finally beginning to show results. Another pleasant surprise was in store for the enterprising young man.

It so transpired that N.N Sippy, thoroughly impressed by the young man, asked him to narrate the story once again before a gathering of film financiers.

The financiers were all bowled over by Subhash Ghai's lively and attentive rendition of the story. Seeing Subhash Ghai's storytelling

prowess coupled with fortitude and passion, N.N. Sippy grandly announced that not only was Subhash Ghaiscripting the film, but he was to direct it too.

Although he had never directed before, Subhash Ghai took on the challenge of working on a multi-starrer in his stride and got on with the job. The star cast of the film Kalicharan had Shatrughan Sinha, Premnath, Reena Roy, Ajit, Danny Denzongpa, Helen, Madan Puri, David Abraham and Leela Mishra among others. The movie released on February 7, 1976, and was a huge hit. From then on, there was no looking back for Subhash Ghai. His illustrious directorial career was on its way.



Subhash Ghai developed a camaraderie with his stars resulting in friendships that were rarely seen in a cutthroat industry. Soon after, Kalicharan Subhash Ghai was offered

Vishwanath, again as writer and director. The cast of the film again included Shatrughan Sinha, Reena Roy, Prem Nath along with Pran, Rita Bhaduri, Parikshat Sahni, Madan Puri, and others.

Vishwanath was only his second film, but it was absolutely loved by the audience. The young movie-maker, Subhash Ghai, had put his veritable stamp on making the film the way he saw fit. Here again, it had the right sentiments with the triumph of good over evil and human emotions that were of paramount importance to him. His story moved the audience. This became the secret to his success.

The following year, yet another directorial venture of Subhash Ghai was released. Titled, Gautam Govinda, it starred Shashi Kapoor, Shatrughan Sinha, Reena Roy, Aruna Irani, Moushumi Chatterjee, Vijay Arora and others.

It would be pertinent to point out that Subhash Ghai even as a newcomer and later as a very successful film-maker in his own right was never averse to learning from his seniors such as Manmohan Desai but, before you knew it, the young director, Subhash Ghai, had imbibed all he could learn and created his own style of film-making.





Wearing the **Producer's** Hat

In showbusiness, the show must go on, no matter what the obstacle, a lesson that young film-maker Subhash Ghai learned early in his career. He has often said that a film-maker's job is endless. It requires raising capital for the film as well as overseeing its distribution and check creatives. But, as the Italian film producer Dino De Laurentiis, summed up the matter succinctly when he said, "If no producer, no movie."

So, soon after his successful stint as a writer-director, Subhash Ghai ventured into the business side too by turning producer for his musical Karz in 1980. This was a mere stepping stone for bigger things--he launched his company Mukta Arts Private Limited in 1982.

His time with mentor N.N Sippy, a renowned producer who had worked with greats like Guru Dutt had given him exposure to the workings of the movie business, the distribution, the territories, pricing and so on. Always eager to learn more, during his stint as writer-director, Subhash Ghai quickly learnt the ropes of the business besides the technical and creative aspects. Yet, Karz, which he produced, wrote and directed did not elicit the rousing response he was expecting in terms of the box-office return because Feroz Khan's Qurbani released at the same time and went on to become a huge money-spinner. But in the long run, Karz became a cult-hit and still continues to find an audience among the youth. The lessons he learnt with Karz came handy for his future projects. Under the Mukta banner he went on to produce and direct many successful films like Hero, Karma, Ram Lakhan, Saudagar, Khalnayak, Pardes and Taal till 2000. It is a known fact that in an unstructured industry, Subhash Ghai's Mukta Arts Limited became the first company from the Indian film industry to be listed on the stock exchange in India.

Going forward, it was Subhash Ghai's pioneering streak and a global vision that saw Indian cinema find newer markets outside of



India. A man who is always looking for new horizons, the producer in him understood the vast potential that the NRI audience held for Indian films. He picked relevant subjects and a younger cast for his films Pardes and Taal both of which he released internationally. It was a business decision that bore results with a homesick NRI population lapping up these films eagerly. Needless to say, both films were superhits at the box-office both in India and on the international platform.

As Mukta Arts grew under Subhash Ghai, besides investing in big scale commercial films like Aitraaz and 36 China Town the company kept expanding its business laterals. In 2003, it decided to invest in low-budget movies with strong subjects under the banner of Mukta Searchlight. Ground-breaking films like Iqbal, Joggers' Park, Rahul

and Black and White were produced under the banner and turned out to be a great success.

It was around this period that Subhash Ghai decided to take a break from direction and took on the mantle of producer and went on to strengthening the company's fortunes. Under his stewardship, the company entered into strategic partnerships like the recent one with Tips Music and also made a foray into new businesses like movie exhibition with Mukta A2 Cinemas.

Walking the talk at all times, Subhash Ghai has successfully combined commerce and creativity, a juggling act that he has turned into a fine art ensuring that his company is always profitable.

Miracle Mentor

Subhash Ghai is not called Indian Cinema's 'Dream Merchant' for nothing. On screen, his films blur the lines between dream and reality. Off-screen too he has nurtured many actors and technicians in the film industry making their dreams come true. He has a keen eye for picking talent, young or old and he has never hesitated in giving them a break and promoting or grooming them, making them stars. In doing so he has created a talent bank in the film industry. Names such as Madhuri Dixit, Mahima Chaudhary Manisha Koirala, Meenakshi Seshadri, Anil Kapoor, and Jackie Shroff owe Subhash Ghai their launch into stardom, an undisputed fact acknowledged by them.

At a time when Amitabh Bachchan was the leading star of Indian Cinema, Subhash Ghai, took the bold step to cast new talent for his movie Hero.


He decided to launch Jackie Shroff who was then an upcoming model and Meenakshi Seshadri who was Miss India 1981. And, in spite of featuring newbies in the main lead, Hero was declared an 'All-time Blockbuster' of the era. Overnight, Jackie Shroff and Meenakshi Seshadri went on to become successful stars. The movie had several shows running in theatres for over 750 days in many cities. While the younger audiences enjoyed the performances of the actors, the critics who had earlier questioned Subhash Ghai's casting decisions applauded Subhash Ghai for his gumption in introducing new talent.

In choosing young stars, Subhash Ghai has always brought a fresh appeal to the films he made. Manisha Koirala was Subhash Ghai's instant choice for Saudagar when he saw her in the lobby of a hotel. Mahima Chowdhary, the heroine of Pardes was another suitable candidate for the role of Kusum Ganga, the girl who is caught in a dilemma between following her Indian values as against her own heart's desires.

I have grown up watching Shubhash sir's movies. He is a very versatile and dedicated director and it always comes across in his films

Interestingly, he not only had an eye for new talent but also for that of veterans who were considered past their prime. He pulled off a coup when he cast veteran superstars Dilip Kumar and Raaj Kumar in Saudagar. The two had worked in a film called Paigham and did not work together ever since as they did not get along as co-stars. But Subhash Ghai not only cast them together, he also completed the film with both the actors eventually giving their best to the film. The powerhouse performances Subhash Ghai extracted from them contributed towards making Saudagar a huge success.

Besides actors, Subhash Ghai has also given opportunities to newcomers in other domains like music, direction and so forth. Anuradha Paudwal was yet another remarkable find who he introduced with the song Tu Mera Janu Hai. It earned her a nomination for the Best Playback Singer.



His remarkable ability to spot and train different talent as per their unique temperament and vocation always drawing the best from them has held him in good stead. According to him, the rules to make one's dreams come true are simple: For starters one needs to respect and love people to receive the same. One needs to explore and always think ahead. And one should do one's job not as an employee but as an employer!

"Work for yourself, value yourself and ask yourself whether you are improving or not," is the advice that Subhash Ghai often shares with his young colleagues and students.

That he has gone on to set up Whistling Woods International to train and groom young talent in different disciplines of film-making is a fitting culmination to his life-long endeavor.

Music For The Soul



Music has always been an integral part of Subhash Ghai's life and films. He has an ear for rhythm and sound, a skill that was well honed during his college days and also at FTII when he studied the intricacies of sound. Aware of the significance of songs in Hindi films, the master film-craftsman used it very effectively in all his films.

With over 100 melodious and super hit songs, Subhash Ghai along with his collaborators has created an unforgettable, unparalleledmusical legacy. From Karz to Taal, from Yaadein to Kisna, Hero to Yuvvraaj, Subhash Ghai was always in step with changing musical tastes.

Given his keen understanding of music, Subhash Ghai was well aware that lyrics and a good tune were key to musical success and he therefore opted for lyricists with a deep knowledge of words. Men of letters who could string together songs that suitably fit into a given situation in the film.

Amongst lyricists, the late Anand Bakshi was Subhash Ghai's favourite and they worked together on numerous movieslike Karz, Saudagarand Pardes, which arestill celebrated for their riveting music. The iconic Gulzar was another noted lyricistSubhash Ghai joined forces with for creating memorable lyrics for the songs in the film Yuvvraaj.

Subhash Ghai's musical instincts and his knack for picking up the right note has stood him in good stead in bringing out evergreen songs that have musicality and lyrics that touch one's soul. For instance, Subhash Ghai and the music duo of Laxmikant-Pyarelal created history with the movie, Karz - it was a music album of revolutionary music with songs like Ek Haseena Thi, Om Shanti Om and Dard-E-Dil. The music was a hit even before the film released. It was nothing but pure genius in the marketing of his film, with trade pundits forecasting and creating the buzz that the upcoming film too would be a surefire hit.

Like in the case of Karz, in many other cases, hit music and lyrics have heralded the success of Subhash Ghai films.


Subhash Ghai and the music duo of Laxmikant-Pyarelal worked their magic again with the signature flute tune of Hero. This was definitely another musical masterstroke





from the collaborators. The lilting melody still continues to be played and is remembered as one of the movie's many highlights. For the song Lambi Judai, from Hero, Subhash Ghai managed to rope in Reshma, the legendary Pakistani singer to sing for an Indian film. The album became a huge success.

The songs My Name is Lakhan from Ram Lakhan, Saudagar's memorable Imli Ka Boota, arestill popular tracks till this day. Karma's Ae Watan Tere Liyeand Pardes'l love My Indiaare played every year at Republic or Independence Day celebration and continue to be among the most patriotic songs ever to be made in Indian cinema.











Subhash Ghai always introduced a novelty factor either with new singers or a concept to lend freshness to the songs in his films. To cite an example, Khalnayak's controversial, yet most popular song rendered by Alka Yagnik and Ila Arun, Choli Ke Peeche Kya Hai picturised on Madhuri Dixit was an instant hit. Subhash Ghai knew what his audience wanted in a song picturisation and he had the imagination to portray it beautifully on screen. Thanks to Saroj Khan's choreography and Madhuri Dixit's expressions in the music video, it had the rustic robustness without making it look vulgar.






For Pardes the director worked with the music duo Nadeem-Shravan for the first time and the film's album was released in New Delhi with much fanfare on the occasion of 50 years of Indian Independence in 1997. To capture the mood of the moment, they created the I Love My India track along with romantic songs like Meri Mehbooba and Do Dil Mil Rahe Hain. Sonu Nigam's breakthrough performance Yeh Dil Deewana turned the film into a musical hit.

Taal being a story about musicians saw Subhash Ghai bring A.R. Rahman on board and Rahman didn't disappoint. He worked for 70 nights to create the marvellous music that resulted in a stupendous success. It was established beyond doubt that nobody knew his film music quite like Subhash Ghai.

Subhash Ghai's subsequent movies like Yaadein, Kisna: The Warrior Poet, and Yuvvraaj also displayed the freshness of music in the films. In fact, it was for Yuvvraaj that the song Jai Ho was composed along with A.R. Rahman. However, it could not be used, and later Subhash Ghai gave Rahman the permission to use it in Danny Boyle's film Slumdog Millionaire. The song went on to eventually win an Oscar!













Interview with

Meghna Ghai Puri

President, Whistling Woods International

Being the daughter to Subhash Ghai and Mukta/Rehana Ghai, itwas a foregone conclusion that Meghna Ghai Puri's life would be steeped in films. Fortunately for her, it was her father who encouraged her to step away from the home turf and pursue her studies abroad. Always a pioneer, he was grooming his daughter to take up the mantle of handling and setting up his pet project- Whistling Woods International. That he entrusted her with this massive responsibility says much about his daughter's competence. In a tete-a-tete Meghna Ghai Puri talks about those sterling traits that she imbibed from her illustrious father Subhash Ghai and why Whistling Woods International, her father's dream project is now hers as well.



Q. How has Mr. Subhash Ghai inspired you personally and professionally?

A. My father has been a constant source of inspiration in both my personal and professional life. His passion for his work made me realise that work could never be mundane or boring. He has always encouraged me to be independent and ensure that my work speaks for me. Also, the biggest inspiration from my father is to learn to take success and failure, joy and sorrow, in your stride. Enjoy your success, but don't let it ever take over your life. Always remember where you came from. Use your failures as stepping stones in life.

Q. What makes Whistling Woods International unique and what is its USP?

A. The curriculum at Whistling Woods International is a unique hybrid of theoretical and practical knowledge and ensures that the creative dovetails well with the business aspects. Mukta Arts Limited is one of India's leading production houses with business interests across the entertainment spectrum, from Education to Exhibition. Founded by Subhash Ghai in the year 1978, the company has a library of over 40 hit films and has a brand that is globally recognised with quality and mass market entertainment. Since its inception, it has diversified into various businesses such as production (film, television and digital), distribution, exhibition and education.

Under the tutelage of Subhash Ghai, Mukta Arts Limited has pioneered many firsts in India that have laid a blueprint for the industry to follow. It has consistently led the corporatisation of the Indian film industry with best global practices. It was one of the first to realise the potential of Indian films abroad with films like Pardes and later, Taal. It introduced and pioneered infilm advertising and branding in films like Karz and Hero. It became the first company to establish the practice of film insurance through its movie Taal. The policy is now named the 'CineMukta' Policy. Subsequently, it was also the first company from the film industry to undertake an IPO and list on the major stock exchanges of India.

With so many firsts under the company, Subhash Ghai was the driving force behind each and every step that the company took. In an uncertain film business atmosphere, he gave Indian cinema a structure that has been followed through the years. It's a blueprint that became the backbone of the film industry that had hitherto been the most disorganised. Mukta Arts Limited is the only Film & Media organisation in India that is present across the entire value chain of the industry right from education to exhibition, for both film and digital platforms.

The company also has a distribution business, Mukta Movies Distributors, which has offices across India. It has a programming



JV with UFO, Mukta VN, which caters to over 300 screens and all major exhibitors. Mukta Arts has also launched its own chain of multiplex theatres under the name of Mukta A2 Cinemas. It also operates a single screen JV with Asian Cinemas in South India with an additional 10 theatres to its merit. These cinemas operate on an innovative model and focus on delivering quality to patrons. In a short span of 5 years, presently it operates over 60 screens. It is also recognised as India's







first multiplex chain to set up a property in the Middle East (Bahrain hosts 6 screens). In fact, it is the first Indian business to launch without a local partner in the country.

All of this just goes to show that if you

have the will and the vision, like the young man from Nagpur did, you can become King of a huge conglomerate through timely interventions and expansions.

In 2003, Rahul Puri joined Mukta Arts Limited as the Vice President (Finance and Business Strategy) and has since been actively involved in the development of the company and the release of over 15 commercial films including Aitraaz, Kisna, Shaadi Se Pehle, 36 Chinatown, Apna Sapna Money Money, Yuvvraaj and many more. On the creative side, he has been instrumental in setting up the company's niche film banner, Mukta Searchlight. He was behind Mukta Searchlight's first production, the critically acclaimed blockbuster Iqbal in 2005.

In the year 2009, he joined the company's Board of Directors and became Executive Director, eventually taking on the mantle of Managing Director. Presently he is involved in all the aspects of the company including financing, distribution, production, exhibition and marketing. He shares his working philosophy that he has imbibed from founder-creator Subhash Ghai and a great vision for thecompany's growth plans.



Q: What are the expansion plans for Mukta Arts?

A. Mukta Arts will continue to expand. We will see Whistling Woods International grow in leaps and bounds in terms of students and courses as well as gain an increasing international academic reputation. Mukta Cinemas will continue to grow making it one of the key cinema chains in the country, reaching pan-India and into Tier 2 and Tier 3 as well as the main cities. We will continue to make our brand of films – mass-oriented films for the family and branch into newer platforms like OTT and television.

Q: How has Mr. Subhash Ghai inspired you?

A. Mr. Ghai inspires by his actions. He has a sheer force of will that is magnetic. If there is something he wants to do, he will move heaven and earth to get it done. That 'never give up' attitude is something that has the ability to inspire not only those around him, but also all those he works with.

Q. What have you learnt from Mr. Ghai?

A. My learnings from Mr. Subhash Ghai have been many having worked in close quarters with him. I have learnt how to deal with people and handle pressure. He is well versed with interacting with different people. He is a confident speaker and never minces his words. Not only is he very efficient but he also has an authority about him that makes people listen to him. Put Subhash Ghai in a pressure pot and he emerges cool as a cucumber. I have never seen anyone handle pressure the way he does with a cool disposition. He never cracks and always has a smile on his face. It's a huge lesson that one can take away and learn from the great man.









Q: What do you think about film content/scripts these days?

A. It's an interesting time, I think, for content and scripts. There are a bunch of platforms that can now accommodate films. Theatres have always been the main medium, but now with Netflix and Amazon, there is a more niche outlet for certain films as well. This means that there is a broader spectrum of content emerging.

Q: Is content finally winning over star system? If yes, why?


A. I think content is winning. Even a star has to be backed by good content these days. A celebrity alone can work sometimes, but not all the time.



I think content will always work. There is no excuse for it not to if promoted and communicated well. Recent examples of Stree, Andhadhun and BadhaaiHo prove their point. This is an indication of the how cinema goers are voting for good stories over the stars.

Contributions to the Film Industry

With over 50 years in the film industry wearing the different hats of actor, writer, director, producer and now the teacher, Subhash Ghai's contributions to the film industry have been invaluable. He has enriched the film industry with his experience and knowledge both on the creative and business fronts.



Here's an outline of some of his most prominent contributions:



In a pioneering move, Subhash Ghai introduced film insurance for the Indian film industry. Mukta Arts' production, Taal was the first Indian film to be insured. The insurance policy was co-written by Mukta Arts Private Limited along with the insurance company and the policy, which continues to be one of the most regularly used policies in India has been named after the company – called the 'CineMukta Policy'.





Introduced several new actors and performers and groomed them into stars. He has also introduced various technicians and contributed to the development of cinema.



His company, Mukta Arts Private Limited was the first film studio to undertake an IPO and be listed on the major stock exchanges of India.





He was instrumental in bringing IDBI (Industrial Development Bank of India) and leading film producers to a common platform by arranging a symposium, which then paved way for producers to get corporate loans for their projects from IDBI.





He is one of the pioneers in launching the digital revolution in smaller theatres of India by introducing digital projection systems.



In May 2004 he represented India on the Anti-piracy panel at the Cannes International Festival along with other international personalities from the film and entertainment industry.









He served as the Chairman of National Entertainment Committee of CII (the Confederation of Indian Industries) for two consecutive years and planned several innovative steps towards institutionalising the Indian media and entertainment industry.





Subhash Ghai has the enviable distinction of being the sole film-maker from the Hindi film industry to evolve into an educationist and set up the first private Film & Television training institute in Film City, Mumbai in 2006 with an investment of over Rs 100 crores. Now famously known as Whistling Woods International, the institute



CERTIFY YOUR SKILLSETS

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) describes an assessment process used to evaluate a person's existing skillset, knowledge and experience gained either by formal, non-formal or informal mode of learning. It aims to appreciate the learning, not paying attention to the medium of achieving it.

RPL under PMKVY has three primary objectives:

- It aims to align the competencies of the unregulated workforce of the country to standardized National Skills Qualification Framework (NSOF).
- To enhance the employability opportunities of an individual as well as provide alternative routes for higher education.
- To reduce inequalities based on privileges for certain modes of education over others.

When it comes to employability, India has a huge unorganized workforce sector. Most of the force is either unskilled or semi-skilled, or even if they have skills – certain parameters defies their skills and this leads to increase in un-employability. There are certain people who tend to pick up skills and knowledge in an informal set up where their teacher was observance or working under someone's guidance or a journey of self-learning. As a result, even though they manage to get a job and earn a decent wage or salary, they may not be able to improve their skills. This also affects their productivity and quality of output. They need access to training programs and support from their employers to skill and upskill themselves. This is where Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) can help them get assessed and certified on their current competencies as per NSQF levels. RPL also shows them a path to bridge their current knowledge and skill levels to reach a competency level or go for higher skills for professional growth.





Why RPL?

- + No fee is charged from the candidates for participating in the RPL program.
- + RPL recognizes the value of learning acquired outside a formal setting and provides a government certificate for an individual's skills.
- + Every successfully certified candidate receives INR 500.
- + Candidate receive exposure to concepts of digital and financial literacy.
- + Candidate receive an accidental insurance coverage for three years at free of cost.

RPL is a very simple and straightforward process of assessing someone's skills or knowledge, regardless of where and how these were learned. Unlike other forms of assessments it doesn't judge someone's evidence of competence solely by the credentials or qualifications they have achieved, although this can form part of their claim. Nor does it consider where a person worked, their age, gender or physical attributes.

What RPL does is allow people to demonstrate that they are capable of undertaking specific tasks or working in certain industries based on evidence of skills and knowledge gained throughout their life.



APPRENTICESHIP

Upbringing Skilled Workforce

What is Apprenticeship:

Apprenticeship Training consists of Basic Training and On-the-JobTraining/Practical Training at workplace in the industry. The basic training is an essential component of apprenticeship training for those fresher candidates who have not undergone any institutional training/skill training before taking up on-the-job-training/practical training.

The Apprentices Act, 1961 was enacted with the objective of regulating the program of training of apprentices in the industry by utilizing the facilities available therein for imparting on-the-job training. Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship is the administrative ministry responsible for implementation of this Act.

National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme:

Sharing of 25% of prescribed stipend subject to a maximum of INR 1500/- per month per apprentice to all apprentices with the employers.

Sharing the cost of basic training with Basic Training Providers (BTP) up to a maximum of INR 7500 per trainee for a maximum of 500 hours calculated @ INR 15 per hour.

It is one of the most important modes of training in terms of quality of training, practical learning and enhanced employability of candidates. It is the most promising skills delivery vehicle in the Industrial/training ecosystem of the country as it provides for structured and rigorous training in a real working environment which helps apprentices to acquire skills and adapt to the workplace. It gives apprentices a real chance to put acquired skills into practice and helps them to gain confidence in a working environment.

Given his impressive body of work it follows that Subhash Ghai has several prestigious awards and honours to his credit. He was honoured as a leading Educational Evangelist of India by ET NOW and amongst his other noteworthy awards are the Karamveer Chakra Award by the ICONGO (International Conglomerate of NGOs a United Nations body), an award for Outstanding Contribution to Indian Cinema by International Indian Film Academy, 2015, Star Screen Lifetime Achievement Award (2017), Amar Ujala Excellence Award 2017, The Power to Empower Awards (FICCI) Excellence in Contribution to Society and the Country, and many more.

But the early years were different. In the 1980s everyone was in awe of the talent of this extraordinary film-maker's vision and creativity. What was remarkable was that he seemed to have the Midas touch--everyone--music directors, lyricists, actors who collaborated with Subhash Ghai went on to receive prestigious awards, but his own work as a creator was not acknowledged despite his films being the biggest hits.

It was he who supported Anil Kapoor in establishing his career with the movie, Meri Jung that was a huge hit at the box-office, enabling Anil Kapoor to bag a nomination for Filmfare Best Actor and catapulting him into the big league.

In 1985, Subhash Ghai went on to work with Anil Kapoor, Jackie Shroff and thespian Dilip Kumar casting them together in Karma that also featured Nutan, Naseeruddin Shah, Poonam Dhillon, Sridevi, Dara Singh and Anupam Kher in pivotal roles. The movie created history with the power-packed performances and the patriotic song Dil diya hain jaan bhi denge, aei watan tere liyebut the awards still eluded Subhash Ghai. But he did not lose heart and continued his work with enthusiasm and the tide finally turned with Saudagar.

Starring Raaj Kumar and Dilip Kumar, Saudagar marked the debut of Vivek Mushran and Manisha Koirala and became a massive hit fetching the Filmfare Best Director Award for Subhash Ghai. Since then there was no looking back. With success after success, Subhash Ghai relentlessly went on creating history with an amazing oeuvre of movies and winning awards was soon to become a habit.

The year 1993 witnessed a marvellous film, Khalnayak, starring Sanjay Dutt, Jackie Shroff and Madhuri Dixit. Apart from its unusual story line of love and deceit in this cop and robbers chase film; Khalnayak brought in several Filmfare Award nominations that included Best Film and Best Director. Pardes, and Taal, were the other movies that brought in a series of awards and nominations for its cast and crew.

Films produced by Subhash Ghaibut directed by other director sunder his banner like, Rahul, Joggers' Park, Aitraaz, Iqbal, 36 China Town, and Apna Sapna MoneyMoneyalso achieved boxoffice success and acclaim under his guidance. The film, Iqbal, received the National Film Award for Best Film on Social Issues along with 5 other awards. It was a cherished honour for producer Subhash Ghai.

Subhash Ghai, wrote, directed and produced the movie Black & White, which released on March 7, 2008. Yet again with this film, he made inroads into the international film festival circuit way before others. His film opened to wide and critical acclaim at the premiere of the International Film Festivals of Pune and Delhi.

It is often said that good work gets its due if one perseveres in the face of adversity and Subhash Ghai is a living example.
